

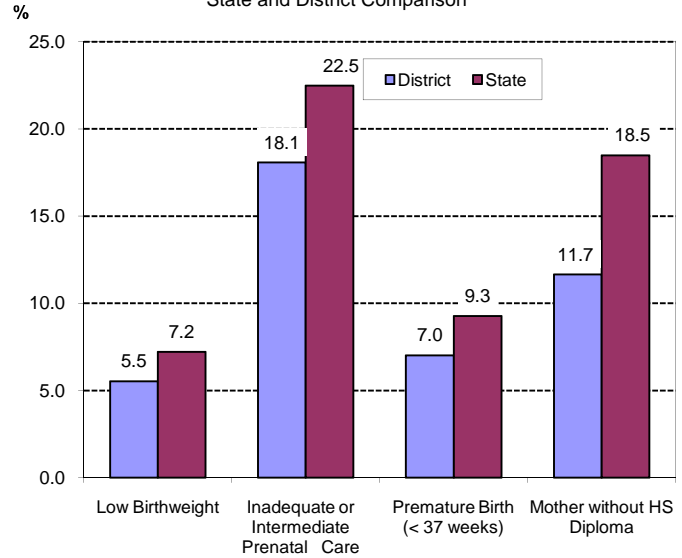

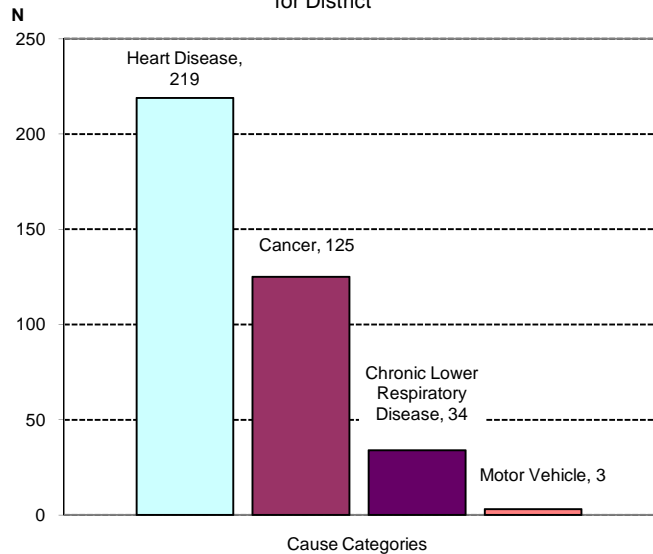
Indicators for Poor Birth Outcomes
